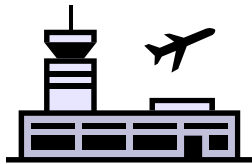

**Year 2007 Achievements**

- A major accomplishment was the culmination of the negotiations with Black Lake Fire Dept to spread the impacts of a major annexation over the next three years.
- A satellite distribution center with the Thurston County Food Bank was established at the headquarters fire station and organized by the Firefighters Union, Local 2409, held once a month.
- Gave fifty station tours and fire safety talks to local youth groups.
- During the Fire Prevention Week in October, gave 22 fire safety talks to approximately 733 children.
- Participated in the development of the Airport Security Plan.
- Initiated a Tumwater High School student program to receive community service hours toward their graduation requirements by having them help prepare for the Annual Open House and Fire Prevention month in October.
- New response zones were identified and put into place. To better utilize available mutual aid units, our pick lists were updated. This will be an on-going project as the city continues to grow. Early in 2008 the response areas for the Black Lake annexation will be finalized.
- Recruitment for a lateral firefighter position was filled by Ken Goldsby, former Fire Chief of the Griffin Fire Department.
- Internal department promotions for, Jim McGarva to Assistant Fire Chief, Darlene Raffelson to PM Lt., Brian Hurley to Captain, Jeff Jernigan to Lt., and Denny Peace to a Secretary I.
- Joshua Stewart was hired as a FF/PM.
- Responded to 2,509 emergency calls within the City of Tumwater.
- Casey Leneker, the departments newest Volunteer Firefighter graduated from the Thurston County Recruit Academy.
- Three auction birthday parties at the fire station were donated to non profit organizations.
- Continue participation in the development of the Homeland Security Region 3 Council.
- Completely revised the dispatch guidelines with the 911 center.
- Renewed the contract with Tacoma Community College. The purpose of this Agreement is for field training and mentoring of paramedic students.
- New portable radios that interface with the existing SCBA gear and increase firefighter safety, were purchased and placed into service.
- Two long time employees retired after over 20-years of service to the City, Lt. PM Mike Routley and FF Pam Webberley.

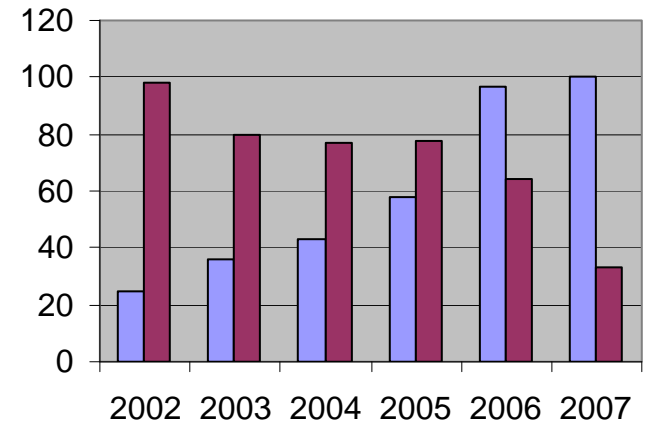
