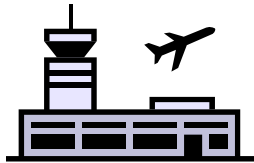


**Thurston County Fire Protection

Fire District #15 is located southeast of the City of Tumwater and occupies 1.5 square miles. Property use of the District is a mixture of agriculture, commercial, recreational, single and multi-family residences. Governing the District is a three person Board of Commissioners. The Tumwater Fire Department has provided fire protection and emergency medical services to Fire District #15 by a contractual agreement since 1967.

Alert I 2 Responses

Aircraft approaching the airport is in minor difficulty. Emergency equipment will stand by at stations.

Alert II 3 Responses

Aircraft approaching is in major difficulty. Emergency equipment proceeds to standby position on the field.

Alert III 1 Responses

Aircraft is involved in an accident and the response is immediate. Emergency equipment will respond to incident site.

Year 2008 Achievements

A major accomplishment was the revising, drafting and implementing of the Fire Master Plan with the consultant, Autumn Enterprises, Richard Small. The last plan was created and updated in the mid 1990's.

A HUGE difference was made towards the Thurston County Food Bank, through the leadership and dedication of Lyall Smith for his major role in the organization of the Holiday Caroling engine. Engine 26 was seen rolling through the very slick and snowy streets of Tumwater spreading cheer to the young as well as the more seasoned citizens. This year 4,000 pounds of food were donated and \$1,550.00 in cash was donated to the food bank.

The fire department has continued to be a satellite distribution center for the Thurston County Food Bank. This has continued to be organized by the Firefighters Union, Local 2409 and has served 253 individuals in 2008.

During Fire Prevention Week, the shifts provided 32 Fire Safety Talks to local youth groups, totaling approximately 725 children.

Replacement hires were FF Jon Kalar, FF/PM West Comstock and FF Donovan Cathey.

The engine company responded to 2,432 calls in the city and the medic unit responded to 1,795 calls throughout the city and the county.

The contract with Tacoma Community College was renewed. The purpose of this Agreement is for field training and mentoring of paramedic students.

Bob Sapp retired after serving the City of Tumwater for 35 years as a paid firefighter.

Dennis Presley retired after serving the citizens of Tumwater for 30 years.

The department received a grant through the West Region EMS Injury Prevention Program, providing 36 bicycle helmets to help promote a more healthy bicycle safety community.

Tumwater's finest Volunteer Firefighter, Lyall Smith, was awarded the American Red Cross Good Neighbor Award. A plaque was presented to him at a breakfast honoring him at the St. Martin's Pavilion.

Seven auction birthday parties to be held at the Tumwater Fire Department Headquarters Station were donated to local non-profit organizations as fundraisers.

Final papers were signed with FEMA so the Tumwater Golf Course and Pioneer Park could be repaired from the December 3, 2007 flood.

FF/PM Josh Stewart (A Shift) graduated from the Bates Fire Academy and was also presented with the "Chiefs Command Award". This award was only presented to 4 members of the Academy.

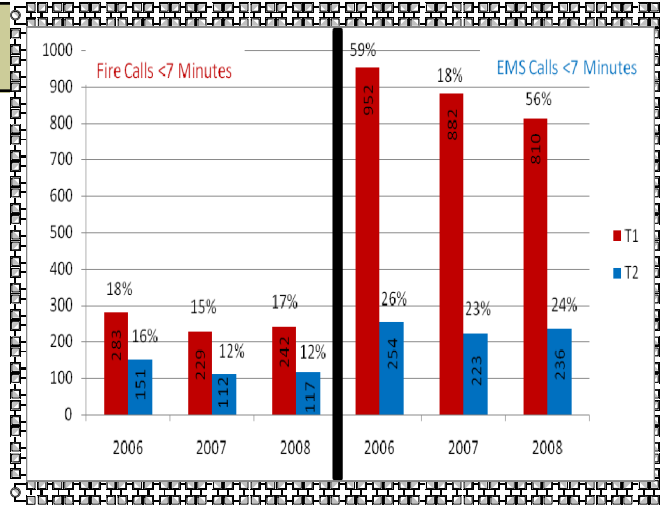

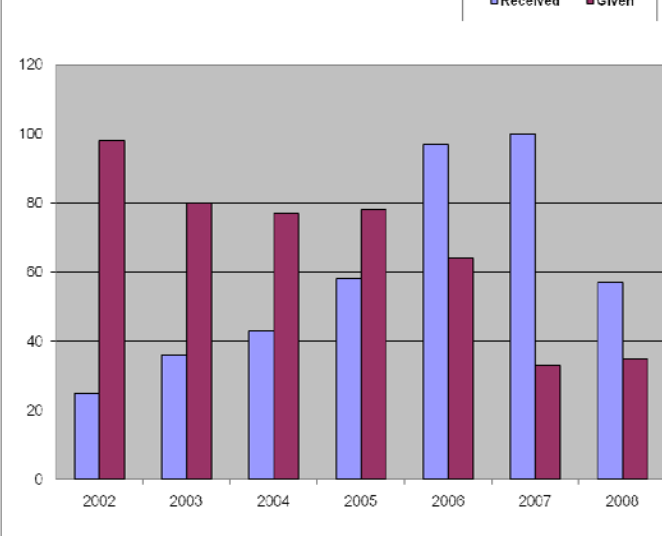
