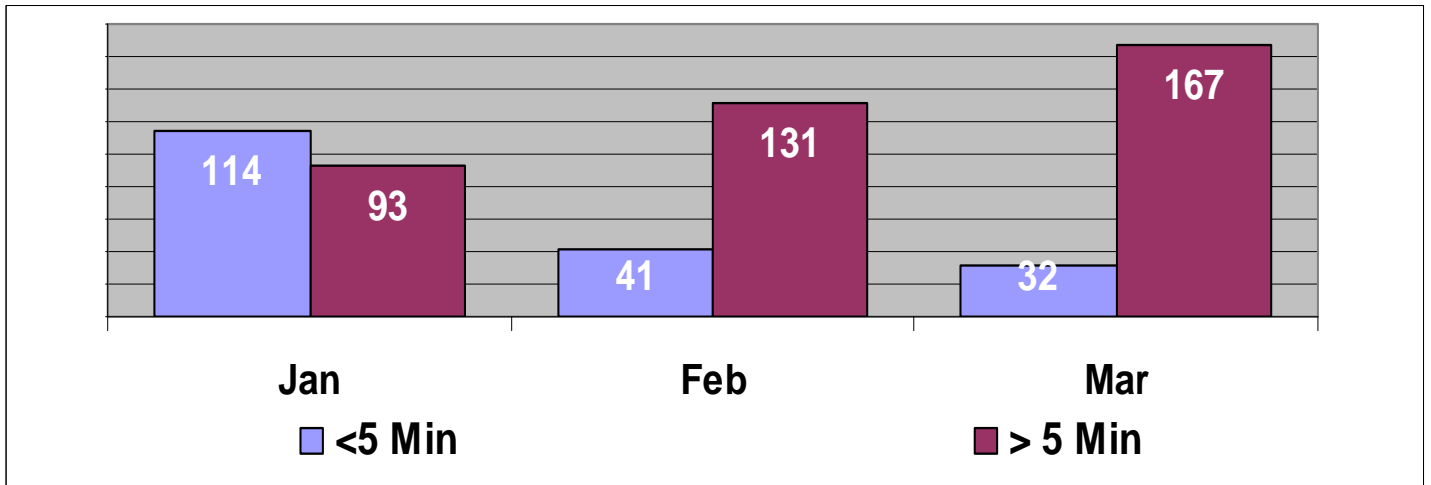

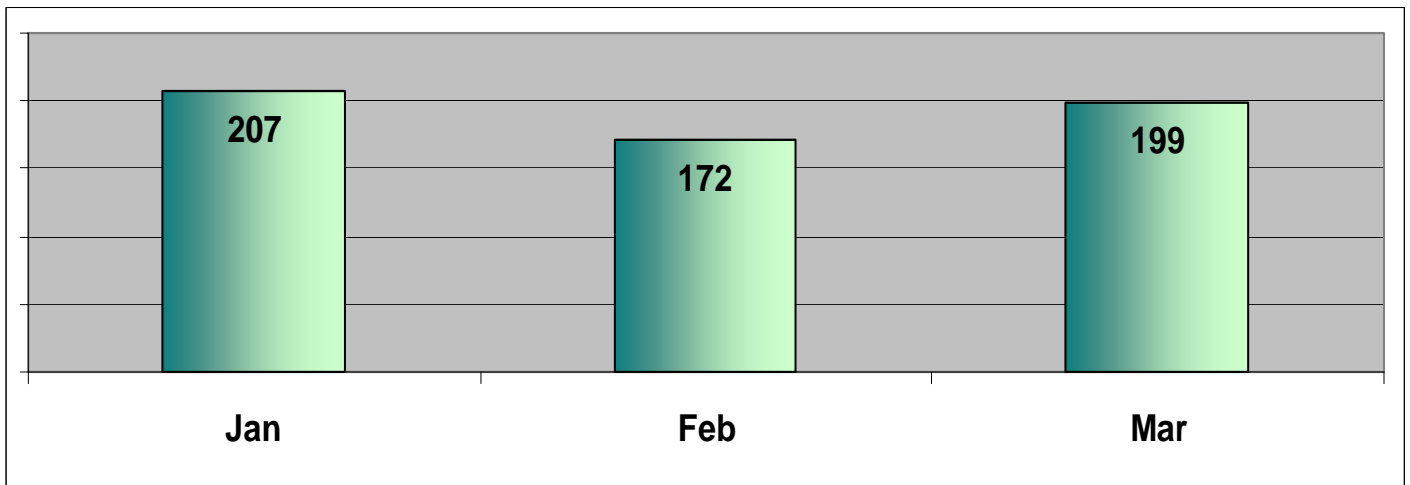
CONFERENCES & TRAINING

- 2/3 PM Darlene Raffelson represented Tumwater Fire Department at this five-day NW Fire Conference. Some of the topics covered at this conference were Training Props for all Depts, Art of Reading Smoke, Elements of Building Construction, Pre-fire Planning, and Understanding Egress.
- 2/5 Capt. Roger Winther and Detective Jay Mason attended the forty-hour training on Incident Management.
- 2/11 Paramedics Gary Burkhardt and Shawn Crimmins attended the Thurston County Medic One EMS Evaluator workshop.
- 2/23 The West Region EMS Conference was attended by FF/PM Pam Webberley. Some of the highlights of this conference were, Prevention Workshop, Leadership Workshop, EMS Instructor Workshop and both ALS and BLS Workshops.
- 3/3 PM Shawn Crimmins attended a two-day Instructor 1 Course. This 16-hr course prepares Firefighters as instructors by training them on the techniques of delivery, lesson plan preparation, and use of instructional aids and evaluation instruments, in accordance with the requirements of NFPA 1041. The course is comprised of completion of the workbook prior to the convening of class classroom lectures, student interaction and final test examinations.

- 3/30 Capt. Brian Hurley attended the 1st of six classes on Incident Commander Type 5 Credentialing through Bates Community College.

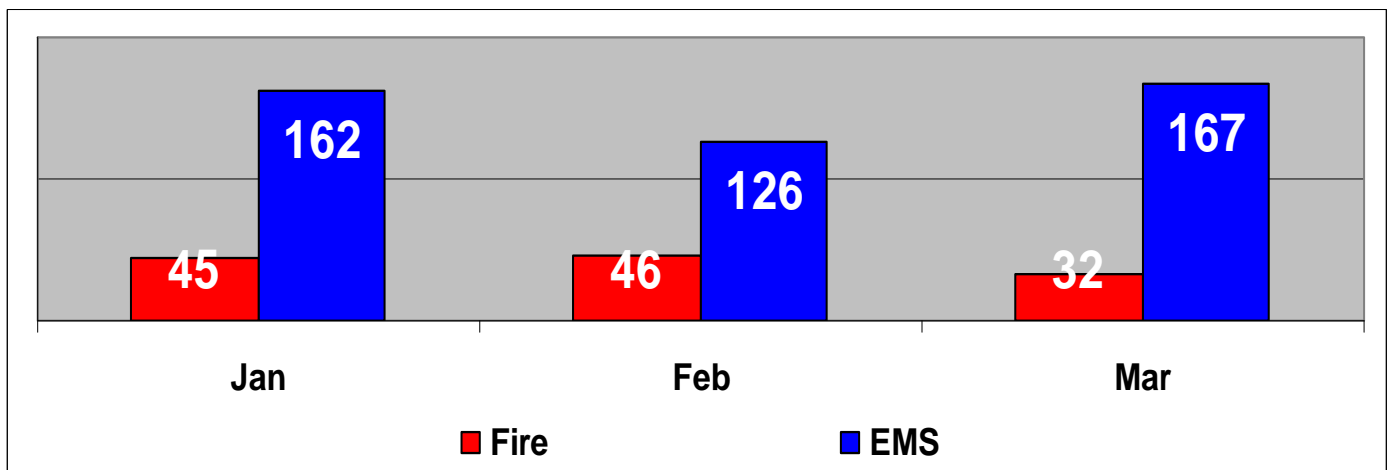
Fire & BLS Response Averages



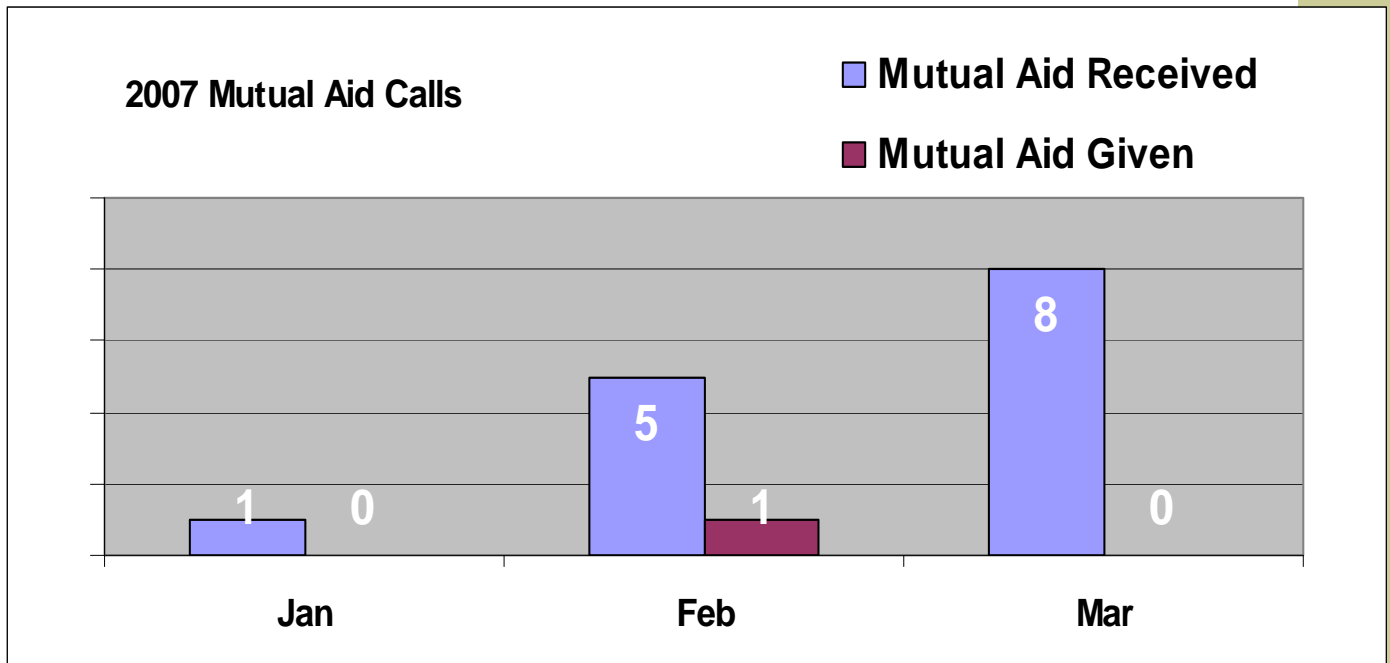
Engine Call Volume



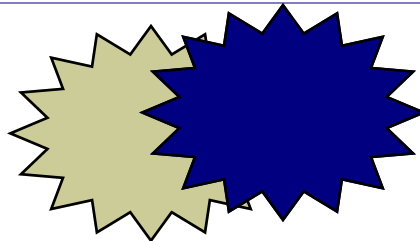
Fire vs BLS
