RE: First Quarter Report - 2008

1. Criminal Activity

The KFC was robbed by a female suspect who threatened employees with a handgun on January 10th. The suspect fled the store on foot with the cash received. Tumwater's K-9 responded and attempted a track, but it appeared that the suspect was picked up by a vehicle nearby.

On January 28th, the Littlerock Food Mart, located at 7000 Littlerock Rd was also robbed. The suspect description matched that of the suspect from the KFC robbery. The female again threatened the clerk with a handgun and fled on foot with cash. She dropped most of the money in her flight from the business and also dropped a replica CO2 handgun. These items were recovered with the assistance of a Thurston County Sheriff's Department K-9 unit.

On February 19th, information was give to us by Lacey Police Department on a possible suspect identification in the robberies. The information was received from an information working with Lacey PD. Further investigation revealed this individual had outstanding felony warrants from the Department of Corrections for Escape and was associated with another individual who had similar warrants. Both suspects were located in the Hawks Prairie area and taken into custody with the assistance of DOC and TCSO. The female confessed to both robberies and was booked. She has since pled guilty to Robbery. The investigation is ongoing in regards to possible additional persons involved.

An Identity Theft operation was uncovered at a local motel by patrol. The cleaning staff at the Guesthouse Inn noticed items used to manufacture checks and identification in the room of a guest. Further investigation led to a search warrant being obtained for the room, uncovering computer equipment and other items used to manufacture fraudulent identification as well as fraudulent gift cards.

An individual who was sitting in his vehicle near the boat launch at Historical Park on February 14th, reported that he was robbed at gunpoint by a suspect who approached his vehicle. The suspect attempted to grab the victim's wallet but was unsuccessful. He then pointed a handgun at the victim and demanded money. The suspect fled on foot with the cash and was unable to be located after a K-9 track.

A female suspect robbed the Albertson's pharmacy two nights in a row in early March. Each time, the female approached the pharmacist and asked for narcotics. When the pharmacist refused to give her the drugs, she stated she had a gun and demanded the drugs. On both occasions the pharmacist complied and the suspect left on foot. She was not able to be located the first night, however she was arrested near the store after the second robbery. She subsequently confessed to both crimes.

Patrol took reports of numerous burglaries in the North Street area during the first part of the quarter. In one of the burglaries several guns were stolen. The U S Border Patrol recovered one of the stolen handguns at a border crossing in Imperial County, California. The investigation is still ongoing.

Detectives investigated six sex offenses during the quarter. They included crimes against both adults and children.
