1. Criminal Activity

Investigations Division

Major Cases

09-583/09-536 Steven Flemones had been arrested by patrol for Harassment and Assault 4th-DV. He made several contacts w/ the victim and tried repeatedly to get her to not show for court. Detectives investigated the case and forwarded additional charges on him. Flemones pled guilty to 2 counts Witness Tampering and 5 counts Felony Viol NCO to serve 5 yrs in prison.

09-071, 09-213 Identity Theft Organization. This group has been involved in hundreds of mail thefts and identity theft related crimes for which they have been charged. The cases involved going through hundreds of pieces of evidence, serving search warrants and interviewing suspects and witnesses.

In January Lt. Mason, Det Kolb and Det Liska assisted the Thurston County Critical Incident Investigative Team with an incident in Lacey.

In January Christopher Snell pled guilty to the Assault 2nd of his elderly father.

Public Presentations/School Contacts

January- Det. Kolb sat down individually w/ all the principals of the BHHS feeder schools (5 schools total) and discussed safety issues, the possibility of Internet safety training for the staff and/or students and discussed their needs in general.

February- Det. Kolb spoke to 5th and 6th graders at Black Lake Elementary on cell phone and Internet safety.

Det. Liska assisted THS admin with a lock down drill. After the drill he provided feedback to the admin staff and staff safety group.

March- Det. Liska and Det. Kolb provided a presentation to all the 8th graders at Bush Middle School on sexual harassment and cell phone and Internet safety.

Det. Liska participated in monthly meetings with the Youth Violence Network

Lt. Mason attended Tumwater Chamber of Commerce Forum meetings in January and February. (In training during March meeting)

Det. Liska is developing a strong working relationship with the Tumwater High School and the Bush Middle School staff and provided training to them related to local gang activity and cell phone related crimes.

Training

Lt. Mason attended two courses on Incident Management. A 48 hour IMT course in Grand Mound, WA and a 32 hour position specific course, Operations Section Chief.

Det. Kolb spent a week training with SPD ICAC/NCMEC (Internet Crimes Against Children/ National Center for Missing and Exploited Children) Division.

Lt. Mason, Det. Kolb and Det. Liska attended a 32 hour course on investigation of officer involved incidents. The class was held in Lacey, WA.

Pro-Active Enforcement

January

Detectives assisted DOC with numerous contacts in Tumwater and surrounding areas. Detectives and DOC made contact with 15 DOC offenders, made home/field contacts with 6 High Violent, 1 High Non-Violent offender and 2 Moderate Offenders. We arrested 3 high violent offenders on warrant status.

February

Detectives conducted warrants checks on numerous individuals with outstanding arrest warrants. Two individuals with felony warrants were arrested and a misdemeanor narcotics crime was located.

K-9 Activity

5 deployments- 3 criminal apprehensions and 2 evidence recovery tracks.

Apprehension #1 on 01/17/09, case # 09-0169-01. This was an agency assist with TCSO. K-9 located the suspect in an Assault D/V hiding in a tree by the Littlerock Fire Station. The suspect was taken into custody without incident.

Apprehension #2 on 01/30/09, case # 09-0656-01, agency assist with TCSO. The suspect was armed and was wanted for Burglary 1st. K-9 located the suspect's handgun hidden in a barn. K-9 pushed the suspect from his hiding place forcing him into a containment unit. The suspect was taken into custody without incident.

Apprehension #3 on 03/27/09, case # 09-1964-03. This was an agency assist with OPD. K-9 forced 3 burglary suspects to a containment unit at the South Sound Mall. K-9 then located the 4th suspect hiding in the west tree line of South Sound Mall. The suspects were taken into custody without incident.

Evidence find #1 on 02/05/09, case # 09-0783-02. This was a field interview conducted by Officers Elliott and Do. The suspect was contacted by the Auto Zone. K-9 back tracked the suspect's travels towards Littlerock Rd and eventually found the suspect's nylon tool box hidden by a tree just a few feet from the Whitey's Auto Auction area fence. The suspect admitted the tool box belonged to him and also admitted to an attempted burglary.

Evidence find #2 on 03/07/09, agency assist with Lacey PD. K-9 tracked a sex offender/burglar from the scene onto Ruddell Rd. K-9 located the suspect's sweatshirt and continued to track to the north on Ruddell. The track was terminated once it was determined the suspect had broken containment to the north.

88+ training hours completed in 1st quarter of 2009.

TNT/ Narcotics Enforcement

January: 12 felony and 1 misdemeanor arrest. 3 search/seizure Warrants. 19 cases worked. \$27,321.50 is street value of drugs seized. 19 incoming intelligence reports. 6 weapons recovered.

February: 9 felony arrests. 9 search/seizure warrants. 17 cases worked. \$151,021.50 in street value of drugs seized. 44 incoming intelligence reports. 10 weapons recovered.

March: 10 felony and 1 misdemeanor arrest. 13 search/seizure warrants. 17 cases worked. \$98,991.00 in street value of drugs seized. 39 incoming intelligence reports. 2 weapons recovered.

Six cases during the quarter had direct ties to the City of Tumwater.
