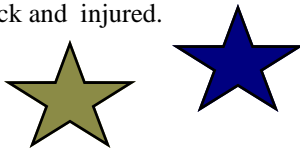

Our Mission

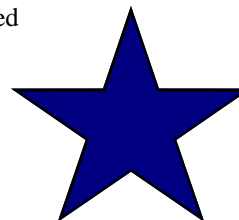

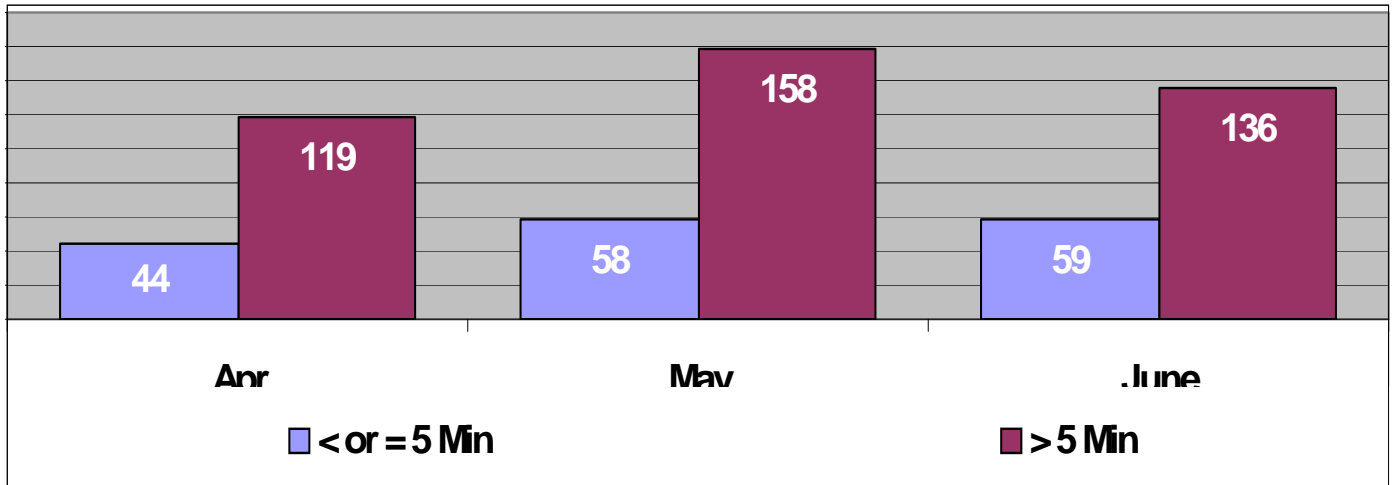

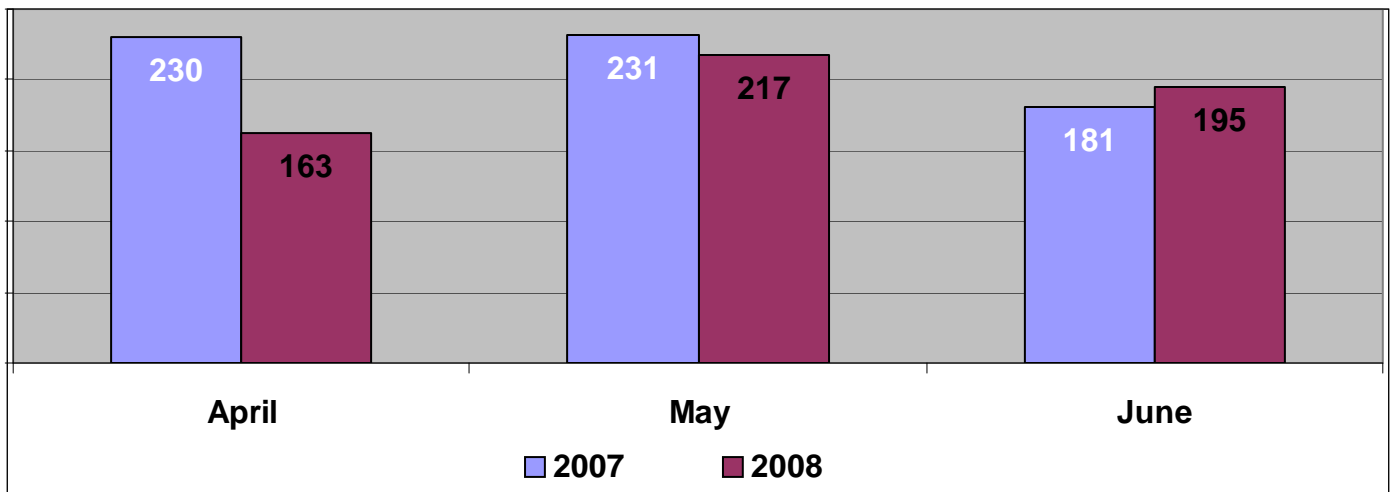
CONFERENCES & TRAINING

- 4/5-6 Lt. PM Raffelson attended the Integrated Tactical Accountability Communications (ITAC) class held at the Rochester/Grand Mound Fire Station.
- 4/22 Chief Carpenter attended the Washington Pipeline & Hazardous Materials Safety Symposium hosted by the City of Bellingham. The agenda of this event included presentations by the U.S. Department of Transportation and other pipeline and hazardous materials safety programs aimed at bringing together emergency responders, pipeline operators and hazardous materials carriers to encourage cooperation, safe incident response procedures, and safe incident reporting methods.
- 4/23 Lt. PM Raffelson attended the second day of the Washington Pipeline & Hazardous Materials Safety Symposium. The second half of this symposium was a Train-the-Trainer session, focused on how to effectively respond to pipeline emergencies in Washington.
- 5/7 Denny Peace received .6 education credits by attending the Rockhurst University Continuing Education Center course, Business Grammar & Proofreading course.
- 5/11-16 Capt. Hurley was chosen to be a Peer Reviewer for the 2008 Aid to Firefighter Grant (AFG) Program. Capt. Hurley and 99 other co-panelists were brought to the National Emergency Training Center (NETC) to evaluate grant applications selected from the AFG grant applications database.
- 5/12-16 Lt. PM Raffelson attended the Annual Fire Investigation Conference in Leavenworth. Her chosen course was Advanced Fire Investigation-Post Flashover, Arson for Profit and Fire Litigation Issues. Lt. Britton attended the same conference and chose to attend the Basic Fire Investigation.
- 5/19 Lt's Ridgeway and Jernigan attended the two-day Aircraft Rescue & Fire Fighting (ARFF) training in Moses Lake, WA. This officer development training covers strategic and tactical considerations in a hands-on live fire ground environment.
- 6/6 Fire Chief Carpenter, Asst Chief McGarva, Capt. Bostick, Lt. Jernigan and Lt. Ridgeway participated in the "Ride and Drive" in Tacoma, WA. This is an interactive event that allows you to drive and compare the Velocity, Arrow XT and Impel chassis, as well as operate a Pierce aerial.

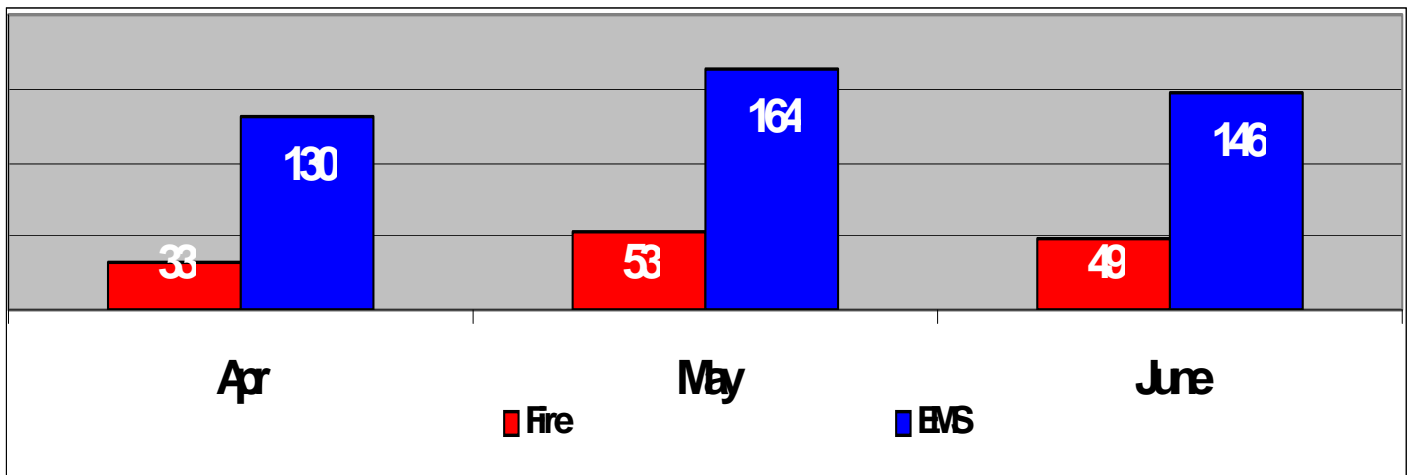
Fire & BLS Response Averages



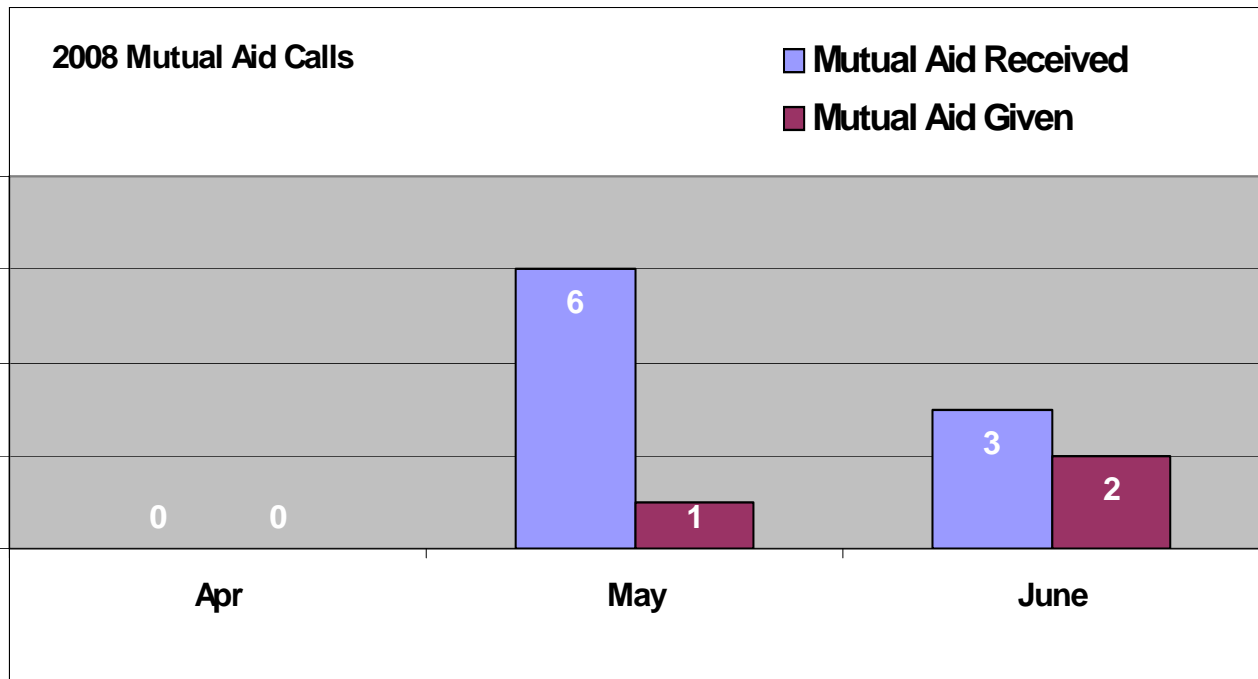
Engine Call Volume



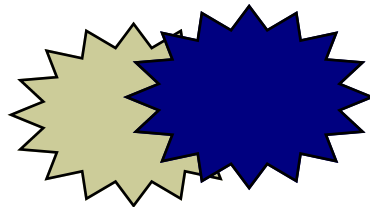
Fire vs EMS
