RE: Second Quarter Report - 2008

1. Criminal Activity

Detectives completed an investigation into a prostitution ring operating in Tumwater. The organization was advertising itself over the internet and working out of an apartment off Mottman Rd SW. This investigation took several months to complete and involved resources from numerous agencies. Five individuals were arrested and/or have charges pending for crimes ranging from prostitution to money laundering and leading organized crime.

Detectives assisted the Washington State Horse Racing Commission with an investigation into possible misconduct by an employee of the Auditor's Office.

The trial for the murder of Jerry Totten was completed. The trial lasted three weeks and ended in two of the three defendants being found guilty of murder in the first degree by a jury. They are scheduled to be sentenced in July 2008. One of the defendants is looking at his third strike resulting in life in prison. The third defendant had already agreed to a plea in exchange for providing assistance to the prosecution. This was the culmination of a year and a half investigation involving numerous officers from the department.

The trial of three defendants for a Conspiracy to Commit Robbery was completed and they were each found guilty by a jury. One of the defendants was also found guilty of Eluding and a fourth defendant had already pled guilty in exchange for providing assistance to Conspiracy to Commit Residential Burglary. They are scheduled to be sentenced in July/August 2008.
