RE: Third Quarter Report – 2008

## 1. Criminal Activity

**Assault 1<sup>st</sup>, child** - Detectives responded to a CPS referral of a 12 week old infant who had been admitted to St. Peter's hospital for internal head injuries which were consistent with being shaken violently. The infant was transferred to Mary Bridge Hospital in Tacoma due to the critical nature of the injuries sustained. Detectives investigated the case and determined the child had been assaulted on at least two occasions and both parents involved and had knowledge of the incidents. The crime scene, apartment, was processed and a video taped confession was obtained.

Both parents were arrested and criminal charges are pending.

**Burglary of the DOH building** - Detectives were forwarded a report of a burglary at the DOH building off E. Israel Rd from patrol. The suspects were caught on video, but no other information was provided. Detectives were able to identify the individuals and they were located in Oregon. With the assistance of local law enforcement the suspects were arrested and additional stolen property was located.

**Burglary/Malicious Mischief BHHS** - 4 suspects vandalized and broke into a shed at Black Hills HS. Portions of the incident were caught on video. Detectives coordinated with patrol and identified the suspects. Detectives interviewed one of the suspects and gained a confession. Charges were referred against all four.

**Possession Stolen Property, Motel 6** - Detectives assisted patrol in a PSP case patrol had developed, including 2 arrests. Detectives were able to locate owners for several of the items

including a laptop computer which belonged to the US Army and contained sensitive information.

**Attempted Armed Robbery, Pellegrino's** - Patrol interrupted an attempted armed robbery at the Pellegrino's restaurant off Cleveland. At the initial contact of the two suspects patrol officers did not have enough information/evidence of the attempted robbery and placed one of the suspects under arrest for narcotics violations. Patrol officers later discovered a firearm and masks hidden in the area. An arrest warrant was obtained and the second suspect was arrested. He was interviewed by detectives and provided a full confession on the plan to rob the restaurant, with a firearm, as well as another home invasion/burglary that they committed in Thurston County.
