Re: Fourth Quarter Report – 2005

### 1. Criminal Activity

The police department responded to a complaint of a subject videotaping people in the shower at a high school wrestling tournament at Tumwater High School. The suspect was found to be a teacher from British Columbia and was caught in the locker room with a camera hidden under a towel. He was focusing the camera on the shower area. The suspect was arrested and eventually charged with 15 counts of Voyeurism. He is still in custody pending trial. An investigation is also underway in British Columbia.

Patrol investigated a case of identity theft which originated when Domino's Pizza took an order with a stolen credit card. Detectives posed as the pizza delivery man and apprehended the suspect. The subsequent investigation led to an additional arrest and multiple charges being filed for identity theft, possession of stolen property, and narcotics.

Patrol responded to several reports of burglaries occurring in espresso stands. One of the stands was equipped with video surveillance and captured good quality video images of the suspect. Officer Quiles recognized the suspect from prior contacts. He was eventually caught and confessed to one of the burglaries. While he is suspected in the others, no charges have been filed in those cases as of this time.

An armed robbery occurred at the South End Grocery in November. The suspect entered the store and threatened the clerk with a knife before taking money and fleeing. The clerk was able to follow the suspect outside and

obtain a vehicle description and license plate number. Detective Summers was in the area at the time and located the vehicle. The suspect was taken into custody a short distance away.

Tumwater experienced a high number of auto thefts in the fourth quarter of 2005. This trend was shared by other jurisdictions in the county as well. This trend resulted in the formation of an interagency auto theft group to share information and combating this problem.

An arrest was made for rape in December. The case involved the suspect, a Tumwater resident, contacting the victim in an on-line chat room and arranging to meet in person. When the two met, the suspect is alleged to have raped the victim in his vehicle.

Six additional sex offenses were reported and investigated during the quarter.

As a result of a traffic stop in, Officer Mize arrested an individual for firearms violations, possession of stolen property and possession of an explosive device. The suspect was found to be in possession of a home-made 'improvised explosive device.' A state patrol bomb technician assisted in the disposal of the explosive.
