Criminal Activity

In late November, patrol officers responded to a complaint of suspicious persons in the area of 65th Way. A resident called in stating there were some suspicious subjects at his residence and a duplex next door. While looking for the suspects, officers attempted to stop a vehicle matching the description given. The vehicle did not stop and a pursuit began. The pursuit ended in a parking lot across the street from the Thurston County Courthouse, where the suspects ran from the vehicle. Citizens assisted in capturing one suspect and a K-9 track located another. Further investigation located a handgun and various other items that indicated a possible home invasion robbery was being planned. Further investigation revealed that the suspects had kidnapped another individual and forced her to give them information regarding the location of their intended target. All suspects were arrested and charges filed.

In early December, an employee at the Guesthouse Inn and Suites called to report suspicious activity. The employee reported that a subject had been renting rooms under the name of a Washington State employee, who they discovered was not in the area or authorizing the transactions. Patrol and Detectives investigated and served a total of three search warrants on rooms at the Guesthouse and Comfort Inns. Evidence of a large-scale identity theft operation was discovered. That evidence included a computer, printer, laminator, and personal identification and information belonging to numerous victims. Further investigation revealed that the suspects had been purchasing large-ticket items including a vehicle using fraudulent identification and checks. Arrests were made at the time of the warrant service, however the main suspect was not located. About a week later the main suspect was arrested by TCSO after being involved in a

pursuit in a vehicle that had been reported stolen to the Tumwater Police. That vehicle was obtained using a fraudulent check as well.

On December 30th, a report of a sex offense involving a 3-year-old victim was made. The investigation resulted in the arrest of a 25-year-old suspect who was a family member of the victim visiting for the holidays. That suspect was charged with Child Molestation 1st degree and is awaiting trial.

Three additional sex offenses were investigated during this quarter.

A total of 17 Identity Theft and/or Fraud cases were assigned to detectives for investigation during the quarter. This represents a small percentage of the total reports taken, as most have no suspect information or investigable leads.

During the quarter a total of 37 reports of Domestic Violence were taken and investigated by patrol. There were also 15 reports of Auto Theft made to patrol during the quarter. That appears to be approximately twice as many as were reported in the previous quarter.
